LANGUAGE AND CULTURE FOR THE PRACTICE OF SCIENCE

What is it?

The Language and Culture for the Practice of Science minor allows students to develop the linguistic tools needed to read, write, and speak about scientific issues in Spanish or French. Through a combination of language, science, and humanities courses, students build on the foreign language skills they developed in high school while integrating scientific reasoning, communication, and culture.





Why do it?

The Language and Culture for the Practice of Science minor allows students in the life sciences to develop meaningful and useful language skills and cross-cultural competencies in one of two global languages. Students completing this minor will leave Virginia Tech with the ability to communicate and interact effectively across cultures, positioning them well to succeed in their future educational and/or career goals.

Who is it for?

This minor is targeted towards students in the College of Science, the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, and the College of Natural Resources and Environments, and will be especially beneficial to those seeking a functional working ability in the sciences in a language other than English.



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Requirements

Elective courses
